GENERAL HISTORY

The first jeep design was a product of the Bantam Car Company in Butler Pa. Bantam worked in cooperation with the US Army to develop the vehicle in 1940/41. In the Fall of 41, just a few weeks before the attack on Pearl Harbor, the US Government awarded the first jeep contract to the Willys Overland Company of Toledo, Ohio. Shortly after Pearl Harbor, the US Government, seeing the urgent need for many jeeps, contracted with the Ford Motor Company to also build the jeeps with parts to be fully interchangeable. By the end of the war, in the summer of 1945, Ford and Willys together had produced over 640,000 jeeps. The tough, simple jeep became the GI's best friend—second only to his rifle.

JEEP MARKINGS

My jeep is marked for the US Navy SEABEES. My grandfather, Emory Hubbard, served in the Pacific during WWII and was with Naval Construction Battalion 3 as a member of the shore patrol in the HQ company.
