GENERAL HISTORY

The M1035 HMMWV was a soft-top ambulance configuration of the HMMWV family. The vehicle had no armor protection for crew and patients and was used to transport casualties from the battlefield to the medical aid stations.

The M1035 was capable of transporting 2 litter patients and a heater was provided for patient comfort. This vehicle provided mobility for emergency situations and a quick link between casualties and emergency services not readily available on the front lines of battle.

Fully loaded M1035 ambulance could climb road grades as steep as 60 percent and traverse a side slope of up to 40 percent. The vehicle could ford hard bottom water crossings up to 30 inches without a deep water fording kit.

This M1035 served as an ambulance in Iraq in the Gulf War/Desert storm in 1990 – 1991.
